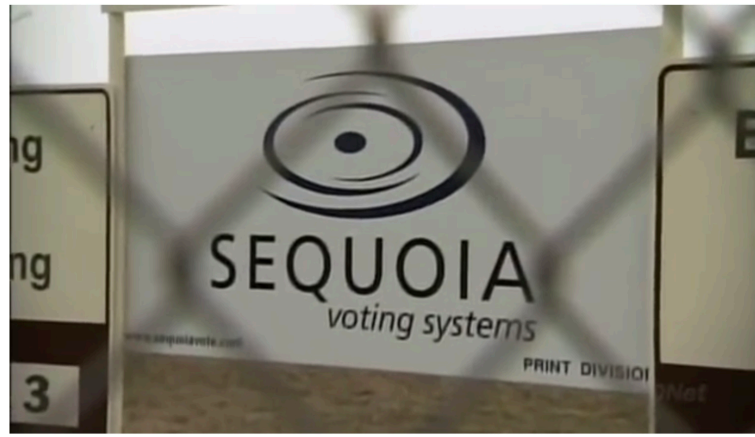

## Video Shows Governor Brian Kemp Saying Anyone Can Hack Voting Machines, Contradictory Remarks Raise Questions

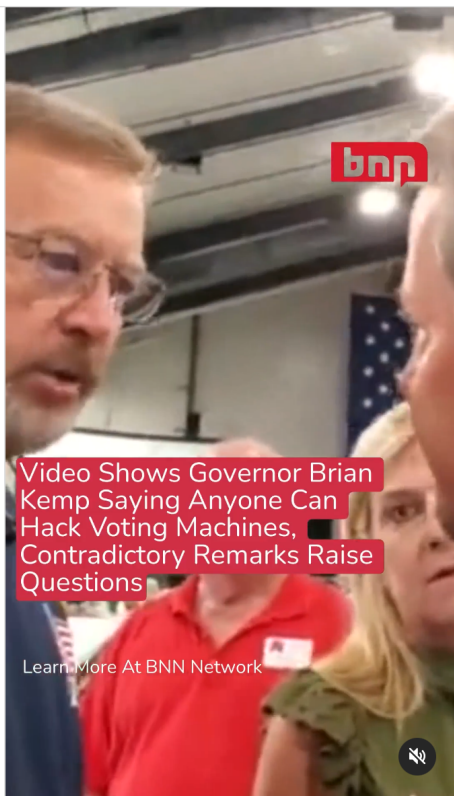
